We believe that children learn best through play! Our Preschool 3 curriculum is theme-based, so each week, we explore a new theme in a multi-sensory way. Students build vocabulary and general knowledge, practice social skills with the support of their teachers, and learn early academic skills in a fun and developmentally appropriate way. We introduce our school-wide curricula: *Handwriting Without Tears, Zoo-phonics,* and *Minds In Motion*.

Children have ample time to explore the classroom and to express themselves through art, music, dramatic play, and self-directed play. Our students build confidence and learn that school is a fun and safe place to try new things.

## Parts of Our Day

- Free play/Activity centers: Students choose from a variety of activities: crafts, easel painting, manipulatives, blocks, dramatic play, and sensory table.
- Circle Time: We sing, dance, play movement games, read stories, and learn about our theme, letters, shapes, colors, and numbers.
- Daily Large Motor Time: We play outside or in our large motor room and run, climb, ride tricycles. This builds coordination and incorporates unstructured social time.
- Snack: We enjoy a snack as a class and practice good table manners and build independence.
- Quiet book time: Students look at books independently while their friends finish snack.
